

Parliamentary Procedure

Although it may seem confusing, Parliamentary Procedure refers to the rules of order used by assemblies and organizations to keep meetings run smoothly and efficiently. It is a way of ensuring that all members of an assembly have equal protections, rights, and can even expedite your meetings! I admit, it may be a little tricky to learn, but after you grasp the basics, learning the rest is much, much easier.

The most basic principle of Parliamentary Procedure is known as “making a motion”. A motion is a proposal for the assembly to take a certain action. If you want to introduce new business or a new subject to the assembly, you can make a main motion. A main motion is a type of motion, and is defined as introducing a substantive question as a new subject.

For example, if you wanted your chapter to donate money to the state charity, you could make a main motion to do that! The way you make a main motion is by saying, “I move to” and then add your proposition, whether that be donating to the state charity, holding a fundraiser, or anything in between. With the previous example, you would say, “I move to donate \$X to the NYS FBLA State Charity.”

How do you handle a motion during a meeting? The first step is to obtain the floor by rising and addressing the presiding officer by saying “Mr./Madam President.” The chair would then recognize you, and say, “The chair recognizes Member.” Now, you can make your motion! After your motion has been made, someone else must “second” the motion. Someone can do this by simply calling out, “Second.” It’s important to note that one does not have to agree with the main motion to second it, just that it is relevant enough to be considered by the entire assembly. If your main motion does not get a second, anyone else can make a new main motion and the entire assembly will move on. If you do get a second, the chair now will repeat the motion back to the assembly by saying, “It has been moved and seconded that [main motion].” Now, the assembly can now debate the motion! Anyone in the assembly can speak, but they must first be recognized from the chair. Once debate ends, the chair brings the motion to a vote by saying, “Are you ready for the question? [pause] The question is on the adoption of the following main motion: [main motion]. Those in favor, please say aye. [pause] Those opposed, say no”. After tallying the votes, the chair will announce the vote by saying, “The [ayes/nays] have it, and the motion is adopted. [main motion].”

District Goals - 9


