FBLA has over 250,000 members not only nationally but around the globe

NFLC

(National Fall Leadership Conference)

This year the NFLC was held in Albuquerque, New Mexico, Chicago, Illinois, and Charlotte, North Carolina



SLC (State Leadership Conference)

(National Leadership Conference)

At the end of the school year, the nations best competitors go to the National Leadership Conference to compete head to head against one another and national officers are elected

Last year's NLC was hosted in Baltimore, Maryland with an attendance of more than 12,000



Competitions

FBLA has over 80 competitive events for members to take part in

Members who prefer to work alone are open to participating in individual tests or presentations

Members who prefer to work with other are open to participating in group tests or presentations

Competitions consist of written tests, speaking competitions (both impromptu and prepared), and presentations

Competitions range in topic and type so there is one for every type of member

Officer Campaigning

Members who look to run for a state or national leadership position must have an interview and submit an application consisting of questions, qualifications, resume, cover letter, and transcript

Once the aforementioned items are submitted on time, members are required to take an officer exam and receive a score of 65 percent of higher

Finally, at either the State or National Leadership Conference, members must delivery a speech for their position, as well as run a booth for their campaign.
