to working with my fellow members and advisors. I'm overjoyed to serve as SVP for District 1S this coming year.




Diya Mangatt State Vice President for District 3N

TNC has goals of maintaining forests within New York City, cleaning the water in the Finger Lakes, and increasing the use of solar energy on LI.


The entire State Officer Team is very excited to bring awareness to this charity and all that it stands for! We hope that you participate and help NYS FBLA support The Nature Conservancy!

IMPLEMENTING PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE AT THE CHAPTER LEVEL

Parliamentary Procedure can be used for any deliberative assembly, or in other words, any group of people who wants to accomplish goals. To start, you may be wondering, "What even is parliamentary procedure?"

In short, it is an instruction manual to hold meetings and make decisions. It is a universal guide to running a meeting smoothly. It can be used to set a structure for your chapter meetings and expedite whatever business your chapter wishes to accomplish. So, how does parliamentary procedure work and how can you integrate it into your chapter's meetings?





Parliamentary procedure is structured around motions, a formal proposal by a member, in a meeting, that the group take certain action. So, now you may be questioning, "How do I even make a motion?" To answer this question, we must talk about the presiding officer/chair's role in a meeting. In a meeting, they are to mediate the flow of the meeting and act impartial to the decisions being made.

Now, let's go back to making a motion. The first step is to obtain the floor or the attention of the assembly. This is done by simply calling out "Mr./Madam President" and standing up. The chair will then recognize the member and grant them the floor by either stating their position or name (Ex: Parliamentarian OR Mr. Aggarwal). The member will follow this by stating the motion in the phrase, "I move (and state their proposal)". For example, one might say "I move that the chapter holds a bake sale fundraiser at the football game on September 24th". The next step is seconding the motion or agreeing that the motion should be considered. This can be done by anyone except the chair by calling out. "Second".

The chair will then restate the motion by saying, "It has been moved and seconded that _______ (state the exact wording of how the motion was originally made). The motion will be referred to as the pending question. Then, members can debate the motion! To speak, each member should first obtain the floor and then they can talk about whether they believe the question should be adopted or lost.

Once everyone has finished debating, the chair will "put the question". This is done by first asking the assembly if they are finished debating and then taking a vote viva voice (a voice vote). The chair will begin by asking, "Is everyone ready for the question?". If silence remains, they will then state the motion and take the vote. This is phrased as "The question is on the adoption of _____ (the motion).

Those in favor, please say aye". This will follow with everyone in the assembly who agrees with the motion to say "aye". The chair will then say, "Those opposed, please say no". That will follow with everyone in the assembly who does not agree with the motion to say "no". The chair will then announce the results of the vote. This is phrased by saying "The ayes/noes have it, and the motion is adopted/lost. (State the actions that will be taken to execute the motion)". And that's it! You have officially made a motion!

Try making a motion at your next chapter meeting to see it in action! Parliamentary Procedure can be used differently to fit all chapters, but the reasons to use it will always remain the same. Learning Parliamentary Procedure will expedite business and provide a structure for your chapter to follow for meetings. 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
EDITOR'S NOTE


