NEW YORK STATE FBLA HISTORY




This year marks New York FBLA's 78th year! The organization began all the way back in 1946, with Dobbs Ferry High School being the first chartered chapter in New York State. On April 15, 1964, New York became the 35th state recognized by the National Future Business Leaders of America by receiving its State Association Charter.


NYS FBLA was originally composed of 13 districts following the State Education Departments regions. With membership quickly growing, NYS FBLA expanded. In 1981, District 1 (Long Island) was divided into District 1N (Nassau County) and District 1S (Suffolk County) due to its significant geographic size and population. Similarly, in July 2001, the lower Hudson River Valley's District 3 was split into District 3 North (3N) and District 3 South (3S), increasing the total number of districts to fifteen.

Now the organization has over 190 chapters with over 4,000 members and is a vital part of the Eastern Region FBLA. The first State Leadership Conference occurred in 1966 at SUNY Cobleskill. From there it has moved around the state: the Catskills, Niagara Falls, Binghamton, and Rochester. Attendance and enthusiasm at SLC still remains at extraordinary levels.



STATE CHARITY

Through research and therapy, St. Jude Children's Research Hospital seeks to develop preventative measures and cures for pediatric diseases. At St. Jude's, no child is denied care because of their ethnicity, religion, or family's financial situation. While investing in tools and resources for state-of-the-art scientific research, St. Jude specializes in treating some of the most difficult pediatric diseases like cancer. U.S. News & World Report has also listed St. Jude as one of the country's best children's cancer hospitals.

In addition to other life-threatening illnesses, they treat children with cancer, blood disorders, neurological disorders, and infectious diseases.

Additionally, St. Jude never bills families for meals, lodging, travel, or medical care, allowing them to concentrate on ensuring their child survives, which is what is most important. St. Jude is the first and only Comprehensive Cancer Center exclusively focused on children to be designated by the National Cancer Institute. The overall childhood cancer survival rate has increased from 20% in 1962 to 80% today thanks partly to St. Jude.

By supporting St Jude, FBLA has helped give every child a chance to live their best life and celebrate every moment.

They aim to improve the leadership, business skills, community service, and recognition of FBLA high school members. The four levels of the BAA program are designed to build on one another.

THE BUSINESS ACHIEVEMENT AWARDS TIERS:

CONTRIBUTOR AWARD (LEVEL ONE): Students gain knowledge about FBLA's fundamentals, internal opportunities, and ways to get engaged.

LEADER AWARD (LEVEL TWO): Students concentrate on the principles of leadership, investigate their own leadership style, and increase their participation in FBLA at the state, local, district, and regional levels.

ADVOCATE AWARD (LEVEL THREE): Students select a topic or business skill to hone and produce a project in.

CAPSTONE AWARD (LEVEL FOUR): Students create and finish a project that addresses a real-world issue, which frequently entails a competitive review at the National Leadership Conference.
